VALUES 2 | ROOTED IN THE BIBLE 2 TIMOTHY 4:1-4

Being Rooted in the Bible is one of the most foundational aspects of our church. We believe in the inspiration of the Scriptures, that is, the very words that God wanted us to know have been written and recorded for us today.

The writers of the Bible spoke as God directed them, not as robots, but in such a way that the words they wrote can also be called God's words. That is why we preach from the Bible, not as a collection of nice stories, but as the very words of God.

Yet ultimately the Scriptures point us to the true Word of God, Jesus Christ. He is the grand subject of the entire Bible and he is the One that we proclaim in our preaching.


Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching.
